

POVERTY

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Globally, the number of people living in extreme poverty decreased from 36% in 1990 to 10% in 2015.

It is a situation in which it isn't possible to satisfy the basic physical and psychological needs of a person, due to lack of resources such as food, housing, etc.



More than 700 million people (10% of the world's population) still live in extreme poverty today

The United Nations warns that the economic consequences of the global pandemic could increase poverty around the world to affect 500 million more people, or what is the same, 8% more of the total world population. This would be the first time poverty has increased worldwide in 30 years, since 1990.



For those who work, their job does not guarantee a decent life. In fact, 8% of workers worldwide and their families, lived in extreme poverty in 2018. One in five children lives in extreme poverty

Most of the people living below the poverty line live in two regions: South Asia and Sub-Saharan Africa.
